Did you know...

FBC receives one new referral (blind or visually impaired baby) almost EVERY DAY (we had 32 infant referrals in August, 2009)

70-80% of the children we serve are multiply-handicapped

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the national unemployment rate is 9.7% in September, 2009. The national unemployment rate for people who are blind is over 70%. FBC has job training and placement programs for people in preparation to go out into the work force. Our clients learn how to job search on the internet, write a resume, interview, and travel by white cane, bus, or light rail to their job.

FBC provides over 7,000 home visits per year and all of the Braille textbooks for the entire State of AZ

FBC provides the ONLY sports and rec program for blind and visually impaired children ages 6-18 in the state
